

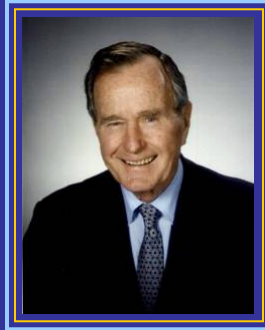

In the beginning...

In 1990 Congress passed legislation establishing the Legacy Resource Management Program to financially assist the DOD in preserving cultural and natural resources.



1990 Congress established the Acid Rain Program under the Clean Air Act

Eligibility Criteria

(Legislative revision, 1997)

1. Project must have regional or DoD-wide significance and involve more than one military department or base.
2. Project must meet legal requirements *or* support military operations
3. Project must be administered at the DoD level
4. Project must not be an Executive Agent responsibility. (Example: the Air Force is the Executive Agent for the Cold War Initiative).

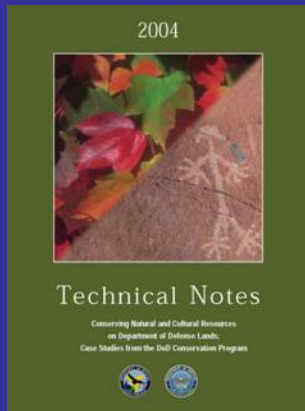

UPDATED: On February 14th, Round 1 of the Fiscal Year 2006 Legacy Resource Management Program funding was approved by the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Installations and Environment. Fifty projects – 33 cultural resources projects and 30 natural resources projects – were included in Round 1. Notification to successful applicants took place via email from February 15-17. We're working hard on prioritizing a Round 2 list, and hope to have more projects approved in the coming months. 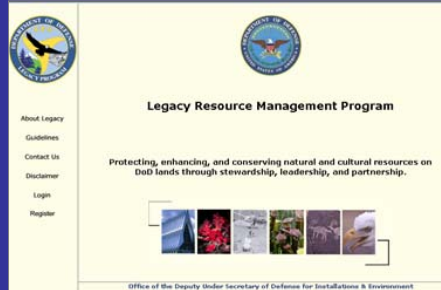
NEW! Funding Available For Environmental Technology Demonstration And Validation (DoD, through the Environmental Security Technology Certification Program (ESTCP), supports the demonstration and validation of environmental technologies that address priority DoD environmental requirements. The goal of ESTCP is to transition mature environmental Science and Technology projects to receive regulatory and DoD end-user acceptance and to be fielded and commercialized more rapidly. ESTCP is seeking pre-proposals from DoD organizations as well as non-DoD Federal organizations and the private sector as described below. **Pre-proposals are due by Thursday, March 9.** Detailed instructions for are available on the ESTCP website: <http://www.estcp.org/proposals>

DoD organizations (Service and Defense Agencies) may submit pre-proposals for demonstrations of innovative environmental technologies in the following topic area:
Sustainable Infrastructure – natural resources management (e.g., ecosystem management, threatened and endangered species, invasive species), facilities management (e.g., solid waste, noise, water/air quality), and **detection and evaluation of cultural resources.**

Highlights DoD Conservation program & Legacy projects

FY05 and FY06 Legacy

- **FY05 total Legacy Funds: \$8.754 M**
 - 57 NR Projects
 - 23 CR Projects (\$2.17 M)
 - 3 Program Support
- **FY06 total Legacy Funds: \$8.438 M**
 - 48 NR Projects
 - 20 CR Projects (\$2.01 M)
 - 4 Program Support
- **Projected FY07 Funds: approx. \$8.5 M**

Who Can Apply for Legacy Funds?

Historic Preservation and Force Protection includes stabilization of historic buildings and archaeological collections after natural disasters and terrorist strikes.

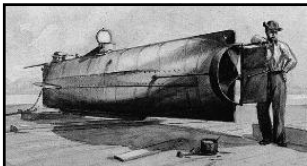
