


Scope - Year 1



Unclear Mission

- Every building? New data for mandatory fields
- Past surveys were <u>only</u> for high risk areas. Two commands, 3 posts. What we knew for sure.







Scope - Year 1

Went to property book office and got list of activities and buildings they owned & maps of all areas.

- 1140 BLDGS!
- 142 Clients



Scope – Year 1



Delineated ADM/IND buildings to best of our knowledge.

Used CPAC, DPW, Real Prop to get UICs for BLDGS/tenants.

- CHPPM response to scope (every BLDG with a UIC #)
- Contractors (BLDGS w/o people)
- Clients (are RealProp signers)



Data - Year 1

Pensacola pilot project had problems:

- With data migration
- Learn from others woes





Very little client participation

- Most of our clients acted like they'd never heard of us; Introduction process
- Gave us the spy treatment; NOT in our area!!
- Questioned our motives; expected a beating
- Clients had not been utilized in the past in collection process
- We've NEVER done this before!!

Data - Year 1



Very little SSN participation:

- Fear of identity theft
- Fear of work
- CHANGE HAPPENS WHEN THE PAIN OF HOLDING ON IS GREATER THAN THE FEAR OF LETTING GO



Increased client participation:

 Added IH roles to some POCs job descriptions as they were promoted

Data - Year 2



- As new POC's came on board, we gave them more active roles in our program
- Made appointments to demonstrate the program with POC's to help squash fears

- The use of social security numbers in this case is appropriate. The use is for tracking and retrieval. This is an official use for government purposes.
- DOD is statutorily authorized and regulatorily obliged to use the employees SSN for medical surveillance






- Meeting with Safety POC's at FMVA

- Focused on tree, personnel, processes, chemicals.






Nomenclature:






