1410 Prevention Strategies** – *Dr. Michelle Canham-Chervak,

Medicine (USACHPPM)*

Falls have been a leading cause of injury hospitalizations  
for active duty Army personnel. From 2000-2005, slip,  
trip, and fall-related injuries accounted for 9.8 to 11.4%  
of all injury hospitalizations among active duty Army  
personnel. Fall-related injuries are also the leading cause  
of Army air-medical evacuations from Operation Iraqi  
Freedom, accounting for 17% of non-battle injury  
evacuations. This presentation will address the outcome  
of literature reviews to identify fall prevention strategies  
that are potentially adaptable to military populations.

With production escalated throughout wartime activities  
at a Navy rotary wing aircraft maintenance facility, a  
fertile environment existed for launching a resourceful  
Ergonomics Program. Implementation of ergonomically  
efficient work methods, equipment design, and  
employee techniques in a production-driven facility  
established in the 1940s took the facility from a \$0  
ergonomic budget to \$1,250,000 within a 2-year  
timeframe.
