Alcantra National Guard Camp

Facility and Location

Alcantra National Guard Camp is associated with the armory located on 320 acres in Wasilla. The State of Alaska acquired the Federal interest in these properties to better manage the assets. The property was originally developed by the Department of Health and Human Services in the 1960's as a juvenile rehabilitation center. In 1976 the property was turned over to the Department of Military and Veteran Affairs for use by the Alaska National Guard (NGAK). In 1986 there was an amendment reducing the property by half to its current size. The NGAK has been active at the site continuously since obtaining the property. The military mission of the Alcantra Armory is to provide training for Military Police and Alaska Army National Guard (AKARNG) scout troops in reconnaissance, surveillance, and tactical screening. There is also an operations and maintenance shop which provides vehicle maintenance and support of motorized equipment used by the AKARNG. The facility can also be used in the support of civilian search and rescue operations. There is no range at this site.

Media Sampled and Findings

Drinking Water — In 2011, two of two samples detected perchlorate at 0.15 and 0.16 ppb.

Appropriate Actions

Not Applicable. All samples were below the EPA and DoD Preliminary Remediation Goal of 15 ppb.
