



California NCS Stockton

Facility and Location

Naval Communication Station (NCS) Stockton was located within the ecologically sensitive Sacramento/San Joaquin Delta. The San Joaquin Delta lies at the confluence of two major rivers, is the largest source of drinking water in California, and is home to several threatened and endangered species.

NCS Stockton was an element of the Naval Computer and Telecommunications System (NCTS) and responsible for maintaining communications for command, operational control, and support of administrative functions; managing, operating, and maintaining facilities of the Defense Information System; and performing such other functions as may be validated by Chief of Naval Operations. NCS Stockton performed tasks as directed by Naval Computer and Telecommunications Area Master Station Pacific by exercising authoritative direction and control of tactical ship-shore-ship telecommunications functions, providing NCTS support to ashore subscribers, and providing telecommunications systems in support of strategic communications requirements.

NCS Stockton has been transferred out of federal control to the Port of Stockton.

Media Sampled and Findings

Groundwater — In 2007, nine samples reported no detection.

Appropriate Actions

Not Applicable. All samples were below the EPA and DoD Preliminary Remediation Goal of 15 ppb.
