Air Force Plant PJKS

Facility and Location

Air Force Plant (AFP) PJKS is located near Waterton, and is owned and operated by Lockheed Martin Astronautics Operation. Operations at AFP PJKS include designing, developing, testing, and manufacturing a variety of advanced technical systems for the space and defense industries, including missile systems. In the past, activities at AFP PJKS have included missile research, assembly and testing of engines, and disposal of ordnance waste by open burn/open detonation. Cleanup efforts at AFP PJKS are currently addressing soil and groundwater contamination from cleaning solvents, fuels, polychlorinated biphenyls, and metals. The Air Force expects environmental remediation at the plant to continue into 2014. The Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (ATSDR) completed a public health assessment for AFP PJKS in March 2000. ATSDR concluded that AFP PJKS poses no apparent public health hazard to surrounding neighborhoods.

Media Sampled and Findings

Groundwater — Prior to 2007, six samples taken from ST035/ST022 reported no detection.

Appropriate Actions

Not Applicable. All samples were below the EPA and DoD Preliminary Remediation Goal of 15 ppb.
