NAS Jacksonville

Facility and Location

Naval Air Station (NAS) Jacksonville occupies 3,896 acres of primarily industrialized land west of Jacksonville and is part of the Jacksonville Navy complex, which also includes Naval Station Mayport. As a master air and industrial base, NAS Jacksonville's mission is to enable naval aviation warfighter readiness. Aviation and anti-submarine warfare training are the primary activities that occur at this station. NAS Jacksonville started taking water from the city of Jacksonville water utility in 2003. Seventy percent of NAS Jacksonville's monthly potable water now comes from this utility. The Air Station still maintains the capability to provide 100 percent of its demand from the on-site water treatment plant.

Media Sampled and Findings

Drinking Water — In 2007, one sample reported no detection. Prior to 2007, three samples reported no detection.

Groundwater — In 2009, 13 of 13 samples at the Pinecastle range complex reported no detection.

Wastewater — In 2007, one sample reported no detection. Prior to 2007, one sample reported no detection.

Appropriate Actions

Not Applicable. All samples were below the EPA and DoD Preliminary Remediation Goal of 15 ppb.
