JB Pearl Harbor-Hickam

Facility and Location

DoD realigned Hickam AFB, by relocating installation management functions to Naval Station Pearl Harbor, and establishing Joint Base (JB) Pearl Harbor-Hickam.

Naval Station (NS) Pearl Harbor exercises military command, provides primary support over assigned shore organizations, serves as regional area coordinator, and provides base operations support (BOS) infrastructure to the operating forces of the Navy, its organizations, and tenants. The mission includes providing guidance and standards for BOS services; assessing and improving installation management functions, quality of products, services, and readiness of assigned shore activities; and performing such other tasks as may be assigned by higher authority. NS Pearl Harbor is part of the National Priorities List for Pearl Harbor Naval Complex.

Hickam Air Force Base was named in honor of aviation pioneer Lt. Col. Horace Meek Hickam. It consists of 2,850 acres of land and facilities bordering Pearl Harbor. Pacific Air Forces (PACAF) is headquartered on the base, and it is also home to PACAF's 15th Airlift Wing, the Hawaii Air National Guard's 154th Wing, which is operationally gained by PACAF, and Air Mobility Command's 515th Air Mobility Operations Wing.

Media Sampled and Findings

NS Pearl Harbor

Drinking Water — In 2011, one of two samples detected perchlorate at 1.6 ppb. 2007, one of two samples detected perchlorate at 0.37 ppb. Prior to 2007, three of nine samples detected perchlorate from 0.05 to 0.3 ppb.

Hickam AFB

Drinking Water — Prior to 2007, sampling results were below the test detection limits during the course of the Phase I and Phase II Military Munitions Response Program investigation. Further sampling was determined not to be required.

Appropriate Actions

Not Applicable. All samples were below the EPA and DoD Preliminary Remediation Goal of 15 ppb.
