



## North Carolina Fort Bragg

---

### ***Facility and Location***

Fort Bragg is located west of Fayetteville covering approximately 161,000 acres. The area includes Camp MacKall, an auxiliary training complex, seven major drop zones, four impact areas, 82 ranges, 16 live fire maneuver areas, and two Army airfields. It provides a home to almost ten percent of the Army's active component forces. Fort Bragg hosts America's only airborne corps and airborne division, the 'Green Berets' of the Special Operations Command, and the Army's largest support command.

The 2005 Base Closure and Realignment Commission (BRAC) recommended the realignment of Fort Bragg by relocating the 7th Special Forces group to Eglin Air Force Base, Florida and by activating the 4th Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division and relocating European based forces to Fort Bragg. Additional recommendations include forming a 16 aircraft Air Force reserve/active duty associate unit, relocating all mobilization processing functions to Fort Bragg, and designating it as Joint Pre-Deployment/Mobilization site Bragg/Pope.

### ***Media Sampled and Findings***

**Drinking Water** — Prior to 2007, one sample reported no detection.

### ***Appropriate Actions***

Not Applicable. All samples were below the EPA and DoD Preliminary Remediation Goal of 15 ppb.
