



Pennsylvania Fort Indiantown Gap

Facility and Location

Fort Indiantown Gap is located in Annville, Lebanon County and was first established by the state in 1931 as the primary training site for the Pennsylvania National Guard. It is also home of the Pennsylvania Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, which oversees both the Army and Air National Guard and the state's programs for serving the needs of Pennsylvania's one million veterans. Fort Indiantown Gap offers more than 17,000 acres and 140 training areas and facilities for year round training for military forces, law enforcement agents, and civilians from across the nation.

Media Sampled and Findings

Drinking Water — In 2011, four of four samples detected perchlorate from 0.06 to 0.09 ppb.

Appropriate Actions

Not Applicable. All samples were below the EPA and DoD Preliminary Remediation Goal of 15 ppb.
