



## Washington Yakima Training Center

### ***Facility and Location***

Yakima Training Center supports realistic, combined arms, joint, and coalition forces training for U.S. and Allied military units in order to enhance unit readiness by sustaining training lands, range complexes, and support facilities capable of meeting all of today's and all future training requirements. The Army provides a large maneuver area in the Pacific Northwest encompassing 327,231 acres in the Yakima area. Yakima Training Center plays a major role as part of the STRYKER Center of Excellence, introducing soldiers to this new equipment and supporting the preparation of experienced STRYKER units for deployment. Users of the installation include: the Fort Lewis and Washington Army National Guard unit; Special Operations Command; Marine Corps, Air Force, Navy and Coast Guard units; local and federal law enforcement; and allied forces from Canada and Japan.

### ***Media Sampled and Findings***

**Drinking Water** — In 2011, ten samples reported no detection.
