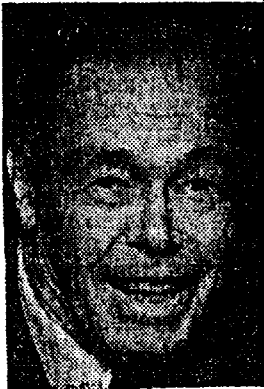

Holt

Born February 25, 1904 in Pennfield Twp., Calhoun Co., died January 16, 1993 at the age of 88 on a family visit in Lubbock, TX. A resident of Holt for the last 12 years, Dr. Walkinshaw was a graduate of the University of Michigan School of Dentistry in 1929. He practiced dentistry in Battle Creek for 39 years, retiring in 1968. After retirement, he resided in his homes on Lake Michigan near North Muskegon and in Lake Wales, FL. Dr. Walkinshaw was world renowned for his efforts in ornithology, particularly Cranes and Kirtland Warblers. He has written several books and a great variety of articles on the subject, having traveled world wide in research for his publications. He has been instrumental in the establishment of several bird sanctuar-

ies throughout the state. Oceana County is the site of the Walkinshaw Wetlands area which was named in his honor. In addition to these activities, Dr. Walkinshaw was active in the Lions Club, Michigan Dental Society, American Ornithologists' Union, Wilson Ornithological Society, Michigan Audubon Society, Ridge Audubon Society in Florida and the Boy Scouts of America, having received the Silver Beaver Award in Battle Creek. Survivors are his wife of 62 years, Clara; 1 daughter, Wendy Schake of Lubbock, TX; 1 son, James Walkinshaw of Holt; 4 grandchildren, Sheryl and Scott Schake, Ron and Alan Walkinshaw; 3 sisters, Christine Treadwell of Coldwater, Virginia Stauble of Albany, OR and Evelyn Sinke of Lowell; also several nieces and nephews. Funeral services will be held Thursday, January 21, 1993, 1 p.m. at Holt United Methodist Church, 2321 N. Aurelius Rd., Holt, with the Rev. Joseph D. Huston, Pastor officiating. Interment will follow in Markham Cemetery. There will be no visitation. In lieu of flowers, contributions may be made to the Dr. L.H. Walkinshaw Memorial Scholarship Fund at Cornell University in the Dept. of Ornithology, in care of the family. This fund has been established to provide

financial support for students in the field of ornithology. The family is being served by the Gorsline-Runciman Co., Lansing Chapel.
