



Conservation | Appendix G: Natural Resources

Department of Defense (DoD) installations are rich in natural resources, including wetlands, rare ecosystems and flora, and threatened and endangered species. Through conservation efforts, DoD maintains the land, water, and airspace needed for military readiness while protecting these assets for current and future generations.

Natural Resource Planning

DoD uses natural resource planning to support conservation efforts. Natural resource planning ensures that operational requirements are met while minimizing harmful effects on valuable assets. Installations inventory natural resources to properly determine management needs, characteristics of these resources, and constraints related to military training and testing activities.

As amended in 1997, the Sikes Act of 1960 requires DoD to prepare and implement an Integrated Natural Resources Management Plan (INRMP) for each installation with significant natural resources. An INRMP is a comprehensive plan used to manage installation natural resources. The INRMP describes how natural resources will be managed to ensure the sustained use of a natural landscape for military mission needs in compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

INRMPs required by the Sikes Act must be prepared in cooperation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and the state fish and wildlife agency for the state in which the installation is located. The completed and approved INRMP must reflect “mutual agreement” of the installation, the USFWS, and the state fish and wildlife agency concerning provisions of the INRMP addressing the “conservation, protection, and management of fish and wildlife resources.”

At least once every five years, the installation, in conjunction with the USFWS and the state fish and wildlife agency, must conduct a formal review of the INRMP for “operation and effect,” and assess the need for a revision or an update. The purpose of “operation and effect” is to determine whether or not the INRMP is working or functioning and having the intended results.

Depending on the specific situation, this could result in:

- ▶ **No Action Needed.**
- ▶ **Update Needed**—An update involves selected portions of an existing INRMP that do not result in changes to goals or objectives, and that do not result in measurable changes to the ecosystem and its integrity. Updates may be prepared instead of revisions if that is determined appropriate and agreed to by USFWS, the appropriate state fish and wildlife agency, and the installation.
- ▶ **Revision Needed**—A revision replaces the existing INRMP, and, if it is determined to be necessary, the process of revising an INRMP is subject to similar procedures of staffing and coordination as the development of the original document.

Additionally, DoD policy requires that installations conduct annual reviews in cooperation with USFWS and state fish and wildlife agency in order to review the goals and objectives of the INRMP, as well as to establish a realistic schedule for undertaking proposed actions. These reviews may be useful in expediting or, in appropriate cases, substituting the normal 5-year reviews (provided these regular reviews are reasonably comprehensive, and the written documentation evidences the parties' mutual agreement).

Installations also identify the management needs of threatened and endangered species during the natural resource planning process. The Endangered Species Act (ESA) of 1973 protects plant and animal species at risk of extinction. Hundreds of threatened and endangered species inhabit DoD lands. DoD is required to protect these species by preserving the habitat crucial to their survival.

Any area that is essential to the conservation of a species can be designated as "critical habitat." The FY2004 National Defense Authorization Act modified the ESA critical habitat provision to allow an approved INRMP to be used by the Department of the Interior in lieu of a critical

habitat designation. INRMPs can be more effective than the critical habitat designation because they provide a more holistic approach to species conservation and provide greater flexibility for installations to manage land and assets.

Legacy Resource Management Program

The Legacy Resource Management Program (Legacy Program) attempts to balance the use of DoD lands for military testing and training with the need to protect natural and cultural resources. Since its establishment by Congress in 1990, the Legacy Program has provided funding for projects that emphasize leadership in exploring new ideas and implementing innovative technologies for natural and cultural resource management. Under the program, DoD installations work in partnership with federal, state, and local agencies and private groups to conserve natural and cultural assets in a cost-effective and technically sound manner.

Legacy Program projects focus on integrated natural resource management, national and international conservation initiatives, historic preservation, invasive species control, monitoring and predicting migratory patterns of birds, range sustainability, regional ecosystem management, and cooperative conservation. Using Legacy funds, DoD has implemented multiple projects related to these topic areas: a course titled "Maintaining and Implementing Sustainable INRMPs," and the State Wildlife Action Plan (SWAP)/INRMP Integration Workshop series.

One such project is a course titled "Maintaining and Implementing Sustainable INRMPs." The INRMP Implementation course lasts two and a half days and discusses topics such as the Sikes Act history, maintenance and implementation of sustainable INRMPs, cooperative management, major current natural resources, public involvement, and funding sources. The course is designed for installation natural resource managers; USFWS personnel; and state fish and wildlife agency personnel whose work

involves installations, the Sikes Act, and INRMPs. The course integrates exercises, group discussions and, when possible, a range tour to illustrate natural resource issues on military lands. By the conclusion of the course, participants have a better understanding of the roles, responsibilities, and expectations of the Sikes Act, as well as enhanced relationships with new colleagues in other agencies. To date, the course has been held three times, with a fourth planned for early March 2008.

A second Legacy-funded program is the SWAP/INRMP Integration Workshops, which bring together the same groups of participants as the INRMP implementation course, albeit with a different focus. Held regionally around the country, the workshop is used to identify how DoD, state wildlife agencies, and other relevant agencies can coordinate with each other to identify solutions to problems relating to SWAPs and INRMPs in a particular region. Four workshops have been completed to date, with a fifth planned for early June 2008. In bringing together stakeholders to discuss key natural resource issues and by creating regional pilot projects, DoD aims to improve the overall management of natural resources in the region.

These are just two of many Legacy-funded DoD projects worth highlighting. The Department has made tremendous progress in migratory bird management through the Partners in Flight program, funded primarily with Legacy funds. In addition, DoD has leveraged the Legacy Program to make significant investments in advancing ecosystem management in places such as the Chesapeake Bay and the Sonoran Desert. In total, the Legacy Program funded 74 projects in FY2007, totaling \$7.1 million to conserve and protect natural and cultural resources on military installations in a manner consistent with sustaining mission readiness.

DoD

In FY2007, DoD spent a total of \$121.0 million to develop and implement INRMPs, as illustrated in Figure G-1 alongside INRMP costs for the previous three years. Figure G-2 shows that DoD has reviewed and revised 91 percent of required INRMPs, meaning 91 percent of INRMPs are updated and approved.

Some installations that have reported INRMPs in the past may no longer be required to do so if the installation has closed, is in the process of closing, no longer meets the criteria for requiring an INRMP, or the Components combined formerly separate INRMPs into new regional INRMPs. For example, the Navy has combined multiple INRMPs into one at the Point Loma complex. Additionally, these percentages also reflect the fact that some installations may have been added if it was determined that they contained significant natural resources.

Army

The Army is committed to managing, protecting, and restoring the natural resources on its installations. Army installations are developing and implementing INRMPs in accordance with the military mission and other installations' management plans and processes. As seen in Figure G-3, the Army spent \$71.4 million in FY2007 to develop and implement these INRMPs. Figure G-4 shows that 98 percent of installations requiring INRMPs completed updated INRMPs. This percentage has held relatively stable for Army INRMPs over the last four years.

The Army's natural resource stewardship continues to benefit from the Legacy Program. One successful Legacy-funded project to highlight in FY2007 was the establishment of a North Carolina Weed Management Area.

Figure G-1 DoD Costs To Implement INRMPs




Figure G-2 DoD INRMP Progress




Figure G-3 Army Costs to Implement INRMPs





Figure G-4 Army INRMP Progress



Navy

Navy installations are often rich in natural assets, including threatened and endangered species, wetlands, and rare ecosystems. The Navy's Natural Resources Program provides a framework for managing these natural assets and achieves an overall balance between military readiness and environmental preservation.

Navy installations develop INRMPs to document the natural assets unique to each installation and balance them with mission requirements, as well as recreational and other land use activities. All installation INRMPs are developed and kept current by a group of stakeholders, including training and operations personnel, and are subject to an annual review. In FY2007, the Navy spent \$6.1 million to fund development and implementation of INRMPs, which is displayed in Figure G-5. All Navy installations requiring INRMPs had updated and approved plans. Navy's progress updating INRMPs since FY2004 is illustrated in Figure G-6.

The Legacy Program continued to assist the Navy with the protection of natural and cultural resources while supporting military readiness. Among other projects, the Navy used FY2007 Legacy funds to conduct a biodiversity survey of marine communities and non-native species in Hawaii.

Marine Corps

The Marine Corps is committed to protecting natural resources on its installations. Marine Corps installations develop INRMPs to document the natural assets unique to each installation and manage them to balance mission requirements with recreational and other land use activities. Figure G-7 shows that the Marine Corps spent \$14.2 million in FY2007 to fund the implementation of INRMPs. This is a rather substantial increase of \$2.0 million from last year. As of FY2007, 94 percent of required Marine Corps installation INRMPs had been updated and approved, as illustrated in Figure G-8.

Figure G-5 Navy Costs to Implement INRMPs




Figure G-6 Navy INRMP Progress




Figure G-7 Marine Corps Costs to Implement INRMPs





Figure G-8 Marine Corps INRMP Progress



Air Force

The Air Force protects the natural assets located on or near its installations through its Natural Resources Program. Implementation of the Air Force's natural infrastructure management strategy has yielded conservation benefits for DoD, as well as neighboring communities and the environment. Since FY2004, the Air Force has made increasing investments to implement INRMPs. As illustrated in Figure G-9, the Air Force obligated \$29.1 million in FY2007 to fund INRMPs. As illustrated in Figure G-10, 72 percent of Air Force installations requiring INRMPs had up-to-date and approved plans in FY2007.

The Air Force uses the Legacy Program to assist in protecting and enhancing resources while supporting military readiness. This program allows the Air Force to fund mission-oriented and cooperative conservation projects that may not be otherwise possible. In FY2007, for instance, the Air Force used Legacy funds to assess Bird Wildlife Aircraft Strike Hazard risk potential of migrating ospreys in the Mid-Atlantic. The Air Force will continue to examine requirements and opportunities for appropriate Legacy Program funds in the future.

DLA

The Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) is committed to protecting the natural assets located on or near its installations, including plant and animal life, rivers, and wetlands. DLA's Natural Resources Program provides policy and funding to ensure the preservation of military and American heritage. DLA works hard to maintain and preserve natural assets, including threatened and endangered species, wetlands, and rare ecosystems. DLA installations prepare and implement INRMPs to manage and maintain natural resources, fish and wildlife conservation, forestry, land management, outdoor recreation, and mission needs. Figure G-11 shows that DLA spent \$200,000 in FY2007 to fund development and implementation of INRMPs. DLA continues to demonstrate full compliance with INRMP update requirements, as displayed in Figure G-12.

Figure G-9 Air Force Costs to Implement INRMPs




Figure G-10 Air Force INRMP Progress




Figure G-11 DLA Costs to Implement INRMPs





Figure G-12 DLA INRMP Progress



Sikes Act Data

The Sikes Act, amended in 1997, requires DoD installations to prepare INRMPs. These INRMPs assist base commanders in conserving and rehabilitating natural resources while supporting the military mission. Installations must formally review and update these plans as necessary every 5 years. Installations are required to report the status of INRMPs annually.

Figures G-13 through G-17 display the status of DoD's commitment to the Sikes Act by Component. Status includes the date in which the most recent INRMP 5-year review was approved, date in which the next INRMP 5-year review is due, and the amount of funding spent to implement projects required in the INRMP.

Installations are committed to coordinating with the USFWS and appropriate state fish and wildlife agencies concerning natural resource management. This effort ensures that DoD, USFWS, and state agencies concur on resource management practices and provides DoD with access to the expert knowledge of USFWS and state agencies.

In FY2006, DoD entered into a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with USFWS and the Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (AFWA) to formalize the cooperative relationship of the three parties. The MOU traces the background of relevant legislation and the history of DoD's relationship with USFWS and AFWA in managing natural resources, and states each party's roles and responsibilities.
