

Department of Defense (DoD) installations are often rich in natural assets, including wetlands, rare ecosystems and flora, and threatened and endangered species. Through conservation efforts, DoD maintains the land, water, and airspace needed for military readiness while protecting these valuable resources for current and future generations.

Natural Resource Planning

DoD uses natural resource planning to support the sustained use of and access to natural assets. Natural resource planning ensures that operational requirements are met while minimizing harmful effects on these assets. Installations inventory natural resources to properly determine management needs, characteristics of the assets, and constraints related to military training and testing activities. Integrated Natural Resource Management Plans (INRMPs) are used to manage natural assets on installations. Inventories of biological resources and wetlands enable managers to develop INRMPs that adequately protect the natural assets at DoD installations. Figure G-1 illustrates the progress DoD made in completing biological resources and wetlands inventories. In Fiscal Year (FY) 2006, DoD completed 80 percent of its biological inventories and 87 percent of its wetland inventories. The number of installations required to complete an inventory vary from year to year because of changes to legislative requirements, regulatory status, or the condition of the facility's assets. Installations update their inventories frequently to ensure that information is current. In FY2006, DoD completed the revision of 92 percent of required INRMPs, as shown in Figure G-2.

Installations identify the management needs of threatened and endangered species during the natural resource planning process. The Endangered Species Act (ESA) protects plant and animal species at risk of extinction. Hundreds

of threatened and endangered species inhabit DoD lands. DoD is required to protect these species by preserving the habitat that is crucial to their survival.

Any area that is essential to the conservation of a species can be designated as "critical habitat." The FY2004 National Defense Authorization Act modified the ESA critical habitat provision to allow an approved INRMP to be used by the Department of the Interior in lieu of a critical habitat designation. INRMPs can be more effective than the critical habitat designation because they provide a more holistic approach to species conservation and provide greater flexibility for installations to manage land and assets.


Legacy Resource Management Program

The Legacy Resource Management Program (hereafter, Legacy Program) attempts to balance the use of DoD lands for military training and testing with the need to protect natural and cultural resources. Since its establishment by Congress in 1990, the Legacy Program has provided funding for projects that emphasize leadership in exploring new ideas and implementing innovative technologies for natural and cultural resource management. Under the program, DoD installations work in partnership with federal, state, and local agencies and private groups to conserve natural and cultural assets in a cost-effective and technically sound manner. Legacy Program projects focus on integrated natural resource management, national and international initiatives, historic preservation, invasive species control, monitoring and predicting migratory patterns of birds, and range sustainment. In FY2006, the Legacy Program funded 71 projects totaling approximately \$8.3 million to conserve and protect natural and cultural resources on military installations while preserving military readiness.

Army

The Army is committed to managing, protecting, and restoring the natural and cultural resources on its installations. In FY2006, the Army completed 133 biological inventories and 149 wetlands inventories. As seen in Figure G-3, the Army completed 67 percent of its biological resource inventories and 77 percent of its wetlands inventories.

Army installations are developing and implementing INRMPs in coordination with other installation management plans and processes. As seen in Figure G-4, 98 percent of installations requiring INRMPs in FY2006 have up-to-date INRMPs completed.

The Army's natural and cultural resource stewardship continues to benefit from the Legacy Program. In FY2006, the Army received over \$1.8 million from the Legacy Program for projects in support of range sustainment and other critical areas.


Also during FY2006, Army Compatible Use Buffers were approved at ten new installations involving over 10,000 acres. These buffers enhance the Army's training mission and protect the environment. In addition, the buffers help promote community partnerships, as the Army worked with stakeholders and received over \$31 millions in funds from partners to accomplish this effort.


Navy


Navy installations are often rich in natural assets, including threatened and endangered species, wetlands, and rare ecosystems. The Navy's Natural Resources Program provides a framework for managing these natural assets and achieves an overall balance between military readiness and environmental preservation.


The Navy conducts inventory assessments of natural resources to identify the full suite of resources at an installation and to properly manage natural assets. As seen in Figure G-5, the Navy completed 100 percent of both its biological resource and wetlands inventories in FY2006. Such inventory

assessments enable the Navy to develop plans that adequately protect natural assets at Navy installations in accordance with DoD guidelines and additional conservation regulations.


Navy installations develop INRMPs to document the natural assets unique to each installation and balance them with mission requirements and recreational and other land use activities. All installation INRMPs are developed and kept current by a group of stakeholders, including training and operations personnel, and are subject to an annual review. In FY2006, 72 of the 78 Navy installations requiring INRMPs had up-to-date and approved plans. As seen in Figure G-6, 92 percent of installations had up-to-date INRMPs completed in FY2006.


The Legacy Program continued to assist the Navy with the protection of natural and cultural resources while supporting military readiness. In FY2006, the Navy received \$746,000 to fund six natural resources projects.

Marine Corps

The Marine Corps is committed to protecting natural resources on its installations. In FY2006, the Marine Corps completed 96 percent of both its biological resource and wetlands inventories, as shown in Figure G-7. As illustrated, the percentage of inventories completed is improving over time.

Marine Corps installations develop INRMPs to document the natural assets unique to each installation and balance them with mission requirements and recreational and other land use activities. As detailed in Figure G-8, 88 percent of required Marine Corps installations had up-to-date INRMPs in FY2006.







Air Force

The Air Force protects the natural assets located on and near its installations through its Natural Resources Program. Implementation of the Air Force's natural infrastructure management strategy has yielded conservation benefits for DoD, as well as neighboring communities and the environment. As shown in Figure G-9, the Air Force completed 84 percent of its biological resource inventories and 89 percent of wetlands inventories in FY2006. As illustrated in Figure G-10, 84 percent of Air Force installations requiring INRMPs had up-to-date and approved plans in FY2006.

The Air Force uses the Legacy Program to assist in protecting and enhancing resources while supporting military readiness. This program allows the Air Force to fund mission-oriented and cooperative conservation projects that may not be otherwise possible. In FY2006, Air Force received approximately \$490,000 in Legacy Program funds for six natural resource projects. The Air Force will continue to examine requirements and opportunities for appropriate Legacy Program funds in the future.





DLA

The Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) is committed to protecting the natural assets located on and near its installations, including plant and animal life, rivers, and wetlands. DLA's natural resources program provides policy and funding to ensure the preservation of military and American heritage. DLA works hard to maintain and preserve natural assets, including threatened and endangered species, wetlands, and rare ecosystems. As shown in Figure G-11, DLA completed 100 percent of both its biological resource and wetlands inventories.


DLA installations prepare and implement INRMPs to manage and maintain natural resources, fish and wildlife conservation, forestry, land management, outdoor recreation, and mission needs. As of September 30, 2006, INRMPs were completed at the Defense Fuel Support Point in San Pedro, California, and the Defense Distribution Depot in Susquehanna, Pennsylvania. DLA completed 100 percent of its INRMPs, as shown in Figure G-12.


Sikes Act Data

The Sikes Act, as amended in 1997, requires DoD installations to prepare INRMPs. These INRMPs assist base commanders in conserving and rehabilitating natural resources while supporting the military mission. Installations must formally review and update these plans every five years.

Installations are required to seek the cooperation of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) and appropriate state fish and wildlife agencies concerning natural resource management. This requirement ensures that DoD, FWS, and state agencies concur on resource management practices and provides DoD with access to the expert knowledge of FWS and state agencies.

Some installations that have reported INRMPs in the past may no longer be required to report if the installation has closed, is in the process of closing, has been granted an official waiver, or no longer meets the criteria for requiring an INRMP.





Installations are required to report the status of INRMPs annually. In FY2006, DoD spent approximately \$117.1 million developing and implementing INRMPs, as shown in Figure G-13. Figures G-14 through G-18 reflect the current status of required INRMPs on an installation level, by Service. The data category "Current List of Projects," refers to whether or not the installation has a current list of projects or methodologies essential to implement the plan's objectives for the next fiscal year. These data are current as of September 30, 2006.

The number of INRMPs required has decreased because the Components are combining formerly separate INRMPs into new regional INRMPs, For example, the Navy has combined multiple INRMPs into one at the Point Loma complex. Additionally, some installations have closed since FY1996.
