EQ Budget by Appropriation



EQ Recurring Costs





Compliance Recurring Costs: Reduction in Compliance Recurring Costs is attributed to completion of projects in FY 2003 for audits, cross connection backflow prevention, asbestos, lead, PCBs, cleanup, and NEPA. Pollution Prevention Nonrecurring




Figure 7 Department of the Army Budget Summary Pollution Prevention vs. Compliance




Natural Resource Investment by Category


