SUBJECT: Cultural Resources Program Directive

By this Directive, I have established four new Department of the Army (Army) Cultural Resources Program priorities to address the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) of 1966. The four new Army program priorities are:

- The ACSIM will leverage its existing partnership agreement with the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP) to support Army initiatives, to include development of joint ACHP/Army program guidelines for historic buildings and districts.
- The ACSIM will take necessary planning and programming actions to institutionalize the Army Alternate Procedures (AAP) and will develop a phased AAP Implementation Plan. The AAP Implementation Plan will contain the installation selection criteria that establish where AAP will be implemented, and will be executed beginning with the next 5-year Integrated Cultural Resources Management Plan revision cycle at each selected installation.
- The ACSIM will pursue additional NHPA compliance actions for historic properties. This will include Army-wide actions such as the Capchart and Wherry-Era Housing Program Comment as well as installation specific efforts.
- The ACSIM will ensure that an accurate account of historic properties, as defined in the NHPA, is available for program planning purposes.

By formalizing these new priorities as a Program Directive, the Army ensures singleness of purpose, unity of command, and efficient implementation.

## ASA (I&E) Cultural Resources Program Directive

1. Leverage the existing partnership with the ACHP to support the Army program initiatives delineated herein;
2. Institutionalize the Army Alternate Procedures (AAP) for installation NHPA compliance, and develop an AAP Implementation Plan;
3. Pursue new Army-wide programmatic NHPA compliance actions for historic properties; and,
4. Ensure that an accurate account of historic properties is available to facilitate effective program planning.



## Army Historic Preservation Campaign Plan

The Army Historic Preservation Campaign Plan implements the ASA (I&E) Cultural Resources Program Directive by:

- Establishing a Vision statement, goals, objectives, specific targets and milestones, and success indicators for addressing the ASA (I&E) priorities.
- Identifying responsibilities for specific actions.
- Providing the process necessary for the Army to continuously improve the management and execution of the Historic Preservation Program.



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### **Army Historic Preservation Vision Statement**

***The Army will be a national leader in historic preservation through stewardship of our most significant historic properties and protection of the Nation's heritage.***



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### **Goal - Achieve Cost Effective Management Of Historic Army Properties Through Enhanced Program Policy, Guidance, And Management Techniques**

#### ***Objectives:***

- Develop new preservation policy and guidance for integrated program execution.
- Promote innovative strategies to improve economic viability of historic buildings
- Ensure an accurate account of historic properties for planning purposes

### **Goal - Improve The Balance Between NHPA Compliance And The Army Mission Through Regulatory And Legislative Means**

#### ***Objectives:***

- Pursue new NHPA programmatic compliance actions for historic Army buildings
- Targeted execution of Army Alternate Procedures
- Pursue new programmatic NHPA compliance actions to address discord between the mission and archeological and traditional cultural properties
- Monitor pending legislation and regulation for impacts to Army mission



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## Summary

- Development of enhanced program policy and guidance ensures that stewardship and preservation occur with a purpose. New innovative efforts are focused on National Historic Landmarks. Upward reporting, feedback and inventory accuracy facilitate continuous program improvement.
- New regulatory compliance actions improve the balance between the NHPA and the Army mission through focus on entire categories of property types, and on installations of Army-wide, strategic importance. The balance between the mission and NHPA is improved by focusing on NHPA issues that encroach on the mission.



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### Summary (cont.)

The *Vision Statement for the Army Historic Preservation Program* emphasizes stewardship of our most significant historic properties and protection of the Nation's heritage.

- Stewardship occurs through management to enhance the economic viability of our most significant historic properties.
- Protection of our heritage occurs through an improved balance between the military mission and the NHPA.
