Former NAS Barbers Point

Facility and Location

Naval Air Station (NAS) Barbers Point is currently called Kalaeloa Airport or John Rodgers Field. It is a joint civil-military regional airport of the state of Hawaii established on July 1, 1999.

NAS Barbers Point was closed by Base Realignment and Closure action in the 1990s, with the Navy aircraft, primarily P-3C Orion maritime patrol aircraft assigned to squadrons of Patrol Wing Two, relocating to Marine Corps Air Station Kaneohe Bay, now Marine Corps Base Kaneohe, on the other side of the island. However, Coast Guard Air Station Barbers Point, with its helicopters and HC-130H Hercules aircraft remained after the Navy's departure, making Coast Guard Air Station Barbers Point the home of the only Coast Guard air station within the 14th U.S. Coast Guard District.

Media Sampled and Findings

Drinking Water — In 2007, one sample detected perchlorate at 3.1 ppb. Prior to 2007, one sample detected perchlorate at 3.6 ppb.

Appropriate Actions
