



Nebraska Greenlief Training Site

Facility and Location

The 3,211 acre Hastings Training Site has served as Nebraska's primary range and armor training site since 1966. In September 2000 the Nebraska Army National Guard named its training site in Hastings after the late Lt. Gen. Francis S. Greenlief, who was a National Guard bureau chief and World War II veteran who hailed from Nebraska. Approximately 3,210 acres of former Blaine NAD property located to the immediate east were acquired in 1966 and are currently under lease to the Nebraska Army National Guard. This training site remains active and supports two practice firing ranges.

Media Sampled and Findings

Drinking Water — In 2011, two of two samples detected perchlorate at 0.57 and 0.72 ppb.

Appropriate Actions

Not Applicable. All samples were below the EPA and DoD Preliminary Remediation Goal of 15 ppb.
