### **Clark County Complex**

---

#### ***Facility and Location***

Clark County Complex is the newest and largest installation of the Nevada Army National Guard (NVARNG). It was constructed in 1997 on 3,884 acres of Bureau of Land Management (BLM) land held under a Recreation and Public Purposes lease by the NVARNG. The complex is presently the site of the Clark County Armory, Combined Support Maintenance Shop (CSMS) No. 2, and Organizational Maintenance Shop (OMS) No. 4, which are mutually supporting facilities. The units at Clark County Armory use their facility as a readiness center to prepare for transition to war, respond to the Governor's requirements, and provide inactive duty training. The CSMS uses the facility to perform equipment maintenance for units in southern Nevada. The OMS No. 4 uses the facility to provide surface vehicle maintenance support to the NVARNG units at Clark County Armory and the surrounding area.

#### ***Media Sampled and Findings***

**Drinking Water** — In 2011, two of two samples detected perchlorate at 1.46 and 2.33 ppb.

#### ***Appropriate Actions***

Not Applicable. All samples were below the EPA and DoD Preliminary Remediation Goal of 15 ppb.
