BACKGROUND

In February 1984. the Naval Construction Battalon Center (NCBC) at Port Hunners. the Naval Air Weapons Station (NCBC) at Port Hunners, the Naval Air Weapons Station (NAWS) at Post Mugu, and the Naval Chell Engineering Laboratory (NCEL) began a joint effort to form a Restoration Airwison (Board (RAB). One primary purpose of forming the RAB was to create an opportunity to effectively involve the local community in the Navy's environmental cleanup programs (referred to as interaliation Restoration), as well as the realignment of NCEL from it's current location to NCBC. (Note: NCEL is now part of a consolidated Command, the Naval Facilities Engineering Service Center (NFESC).)

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS &

At a Team Building Workshop, held in September 1994, the RAB drafted a mission and vision statement. Also, RAB members decided on the following membership requirements and ground rules:

Availability to the Community: Members should be willing to communicate with local community members and interest groups concerned with specific base cleanup issues. members serve as a facet and reliable conduit for information flow to and from the community.

Document Review: Members are expected to review and provide comments or dut to find environmental documents. A process, including timeframes, for making comments and receiving responses has been jointly developed.

Membership: Membership is reviewed by the Board every six months. The goal is to ensure adequate numbers and diversity of members.

Public Comments: All meetings are open to the public and comments are welcome. An opportunity to raise items not on the apenda is offered at the start and closure of all meetings. The RAB does not attempt to gain consensus on issues, all viewpoints and comments are considered and will receive a response.
