




Rock Island Arsenal




National Guard and Other Reserve Components

The Guard and Reserve organize, train, and equip citizen soldiers/ airmen to ensure their rapid mobilization for duties within the state, nation, and around the world. While all Reserve Components have a federal mission to augment active duty forces in times of crises, the Guard has the additional, unique mission of serving the Governor during state emergencies. Scott Air Force Base
