

## DoD IN MISSOURI



### **Army Corps of Engineers, Kansas City District**

Established in 1907, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Kansas City District (KCD) is one of 44 districts in nine Engineers divisions. Its missions include Civil Works, Military Construction, including planning, designing, building, and operating water resources and other civil works projects such as flood control, levees (such as the Quindaro Levee), flood walls, drainage channels; disaster response; and Hazardous, Toxic and Radiation Wastes (HTRW) clean-up, KCD is the primary design district in seven states and the secondary design district in eight states for the HTRW cleanup program. It is also responsible for naturally occurring radioactive materials disposal (non-fissionable materials) for the entire United States

#### St. Joseph ANG Base

The 139th Airlift Wing, located at Rosecrans Memorial Airport in St. Joseph. MO. flies C-130H Hercules in support of world-wide missions, as a Reserve Component of the Air Mobility Command. Their Advanced Airlift Tactics Training Center trains aircrew from all components of the Air Force, Marine Corps, and allied nations and also provides Tactics Analysis, Tactics Development, and Electronic Warfare Development for the mobility community.



#### **Fort Leonard Wood**

Located in the Missouri Ozarks, Fort Leonard Wood is home to the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence (MSCoE); the U.S. Army Engineer School; the U.S. Army Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear (CBRN) School; the U.S. Army Military Police School; and the MSCoE NCO Academy. Training offered includes Basic Combat Training (BCT) for most non-combat arms soldiers; Advanced Individual Training for Military Police, motor transport operators, and CBRN specialists; One Station Unit Training (OSUT) for combat engineers and bridging engineers; and the Basic Officer Leader Course Phase B for newly commissioned Second Lieutenants, Captains Career Courses, and the Battalion and Brigade Pre-Command Courses in the CBRN, Engineer, and Military Police branches.



#### **Army Corps of Engineers, St. Louis District**

The St. Louis District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Mississippi Valley Division (MVD), is responsible for the navigation support and flood damage reduction on one of the largest inland waterway systems in the country. The St. Louis District area of responsibility encompasses 28,000 square miles and is almost equally divided between Missouri and Illinois. The district is an engineering and water resource agency dedicated to maintaining a proper and healthy balance of the varying uses of heartland waterways including river navigation locks, dams, and river regulation; habitat restoration; data collection including water control, photogrammetric mapping, geodesy, cartography, and Automated Performance Monitoring of Dams (APMD).



The Guard and Reserve organize, train, and equip citizen soldiers/airmen to ensure their rapid mobilization for duties within the state, nation and around the world. While all Reserve Components have a federal mission to augment active duty forces in times of crises, the Guard has the additional, unique mission of serving the Governor during state emergencies. Guard and Reserve units are stationed throughout the state.

#### **Lake City Army Ammunition Plant**

Located at Independence, MO, the Lake City Army Ammunition Plant is the largest small-arms (5.56 - 20 mm) manufacturing plant in the world. With the exception of the five year period between the end of World War II and the beginning of the Korean conflict, this facility has been in continuous production since October 1941. It encompasses 458 buildings on 3,935 acres.

#### Whiteman Air Force Base

Located 65 miles southeast of Kansas City near Knob Noster, Whiteman AFB is the B-2 Spirit (stealth) Bomber base in CONUS, as well as the only one home to three Wings: the 509th Bomb Wing, flying the B-2 bomber; the Air National Guard's 131st Bomb Wing, also flying the B-2; and the Air Force Reserve's 442nd Fighter Wing, flying A-10 Thunderbolt IIs. The base is also home to the Army National Guard's 1-135th Attack Battalion, flying the AH-64 Apache; and the Navy Reserve's Maritime Expeditionary Security Division 13, which provides light, mobile, short-duration, point defense Anti-Terrorism Force Protection forces for USN ships and aircraft and other high value assets in locations where U.S. or host-nation security infrastructure is either inadequate or non-existent.
