



Fort Drum

Fort Drum encompasses 107,265 acres (168 square miles) and is the largest employer in Northern New York.





U.S. Military Academy, West Point Garrison

Located 50 miles from New York City in the scenic Hudson River Valley of Orange County, the U.S. Military Academy at West Point is a four-year academic institution and nationally renowned historic site. West Point is the oldest continually occupied military post in America. As the world's premier leader-development institution. Fort Hamilton
