

Did You Know? Facts about New Hampshire

- The New Boston Air Force Station, home to the 23rd Space Operations Squadron, was renamed to New Boston Space Force Station to better reflect its role in the U.S. Space Force.
- New Hampshire's National Guard has provided service during several wars, dating back to the French and Indian War in 1754.
- The 157th Air Refueling Wing named their 12 new KC-46 aircrafts in honor of the 10 counties of New Hampshire and the two towns adjacent to the Pease Air National Guard Base.

Department of Defense Mission

The mission of the Department of Defense (DoD) is to provide the military forces needed to deter war and ensure our nation's security.

Sustainability and the DoD Mission

DoD facilities on land, on the water, and in the air protect our nation. The Regional Environmental Coordinator (REC) works cooperatively with state agencies and governments on environmental efforts to ensure continued use of necessary land, sea, and airspace – protecting the military's ability to maintain operations into the future and prepare U.S. service men and women to defend our country.


DoD and State Partnerships

Through the REC program, DoD and military service representatives partner with state agencies and governments to strengthen environmental restoration and protection efforts and to promote long-term sustainability of the military mission. Program efforts include educating state agencies and officials about the military's operational and environmental needs, priorities, and concerns; communicating coordinated DoD positions on issues affecting military sustainment; and engaging in state legislative and rulemaking initiatives.





New Boston Space Force Station is operated by the 23rd Space Operations Squadron, a geographically separated unit of Space Delta 6, part of Peterson-Schriever Garrison at Schriever Space Force Base, Colorado.











National Guard and Reserve Components

The Guard and Reserve organize, train, and equip citizen soldiers and airmen for rapid mobilization in the state, nation, and around the world. While all Reserve components have a federal mission to augment active duty forces in times of crises, the Guard has the unique mission of serving the Governor during state emergencies. The New Hampshire Army National Guard was established in 1860, and today includes the 197th Fires Brigade, 54th Troop Command, and 12th Civil Support Team. The New Hampshire Air National Guard includes the 157th Air Refueling Wing, which flies the KC-135R aerial refueling platform to support the U.S. Air Force Air Mobility Command-directed Global Reach mission.





1 Pease Air National Guard Base

Pease Air National Guard Base is home to the New Hampshire Air National Guard's 157th Air Refueling Wing, providing refueling services to the Northeast's tanker taskforce, and employing nearly 1,000 full- and part-time military personnel. The base maintains welltrained, well-equipped units available for prompt mobilization during war and provides assistance during national emergencies. During peacetime, the combat-ready units and support units are available to carry out missions compatible with training, mobilization readiness, humanitarian, and contingency operations.

2 New Boston Space Force Station

As of July 2021, the New Boston Air Force Station, home to the 23rd Space Operations Squadron, was renamed to better reflect its role in the U.S. Space Force. It is now known as New Boston Space Force Station. The 23rd Space Operations Squadron is part of a crucial network of sites operating 24 hours per day, providing critical satellite command and control capability to more than 190 DoD, national and civilian satellites performing intelligence, weather, navigation, early-warning, and communications operations.


Defense Spending by State
