

DoD and military service representatives work proactively with state legislators and officials to build partnerships and awareness of actions that could benefit or impact the military mission.





Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst

Base Closure and Realignment directed the merger of installation support functions for New Jersey's Fort Dix and Naval Air Engineering Station Lakehurst to McGuire Air Force Base. Located 18 miles southeast of Trenton, NJ, the 42,000-contiguous acres of JB MDL are home to Airmen, Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, Coast Guardsmen, civilians, and their family members. The 87th Air Base Wing provides installation management support for 3,933 facilities with an approximate value of \$9.3 billion in physical infrastructure. JB MDL also houses the U.S. Army Reserves, the 99th Regional Support Command, and the Naval Air Systems Command.



Picatinny Arsenal

Picatinny Arsenal is a joint service armament research and development center. The one-of-a-kind facility provides virtually all of the lethal mechanisms used in Army weapon systems and those of the other military services. Situated on a 6,500-acre military installation located in northern NJ, Picatinny is the pre-eminent national and international leader in the research, development, engineering, and production support of advanced weapons systems.

New Jersey Department of Military and Veteran's Affairs

The New Jersey Army National Guard (ARNG) is governed through the NJ DMAVA. Maintaining 64 armories, a nine-acre training center in Sea Girt, NJ, and a presence in 42 communities, the ARNG consists of over 9,000 Guardsmen from New Jersey. Also governed through the NJ DMAVA, the New Jersey Air National Guard (ANG) maintains the 108th Air Refueling Wing, a unit responsible for aerial refueling. They fly the KC-135-R Stratotanker, based out of McGuire Air Force Base. The ANG 177th Fighter Wing is stationed at Atlantic City International Airport and is made up primarily of F-16C/D aircraft.



Naval Weapons Station Earle (NWS)

Naval Weapons Station Earle is located in Monmouth County, NJ, between Philadelphia and New York City. Earle's main base (Mainside) encompasses 10,160 acres 15 miles west of the Central Jersey Shore. Twelve miles to the north of Mainside is Earle's Waterfront facility, in Middletown Township. Earle's Waterfront pier complex, one of the longest finger piers in the world, extends 2.5 miles into Raritan Bay. Connecting Mainside and the Waterfront is Normandy Road, a Navy-controlled rail and road corridor. NWS Earle provides ordnance for all Atlantic Fleet Carrier and Expeditionary Strike Groups, and supports strategic DoD ordnance requirements.
